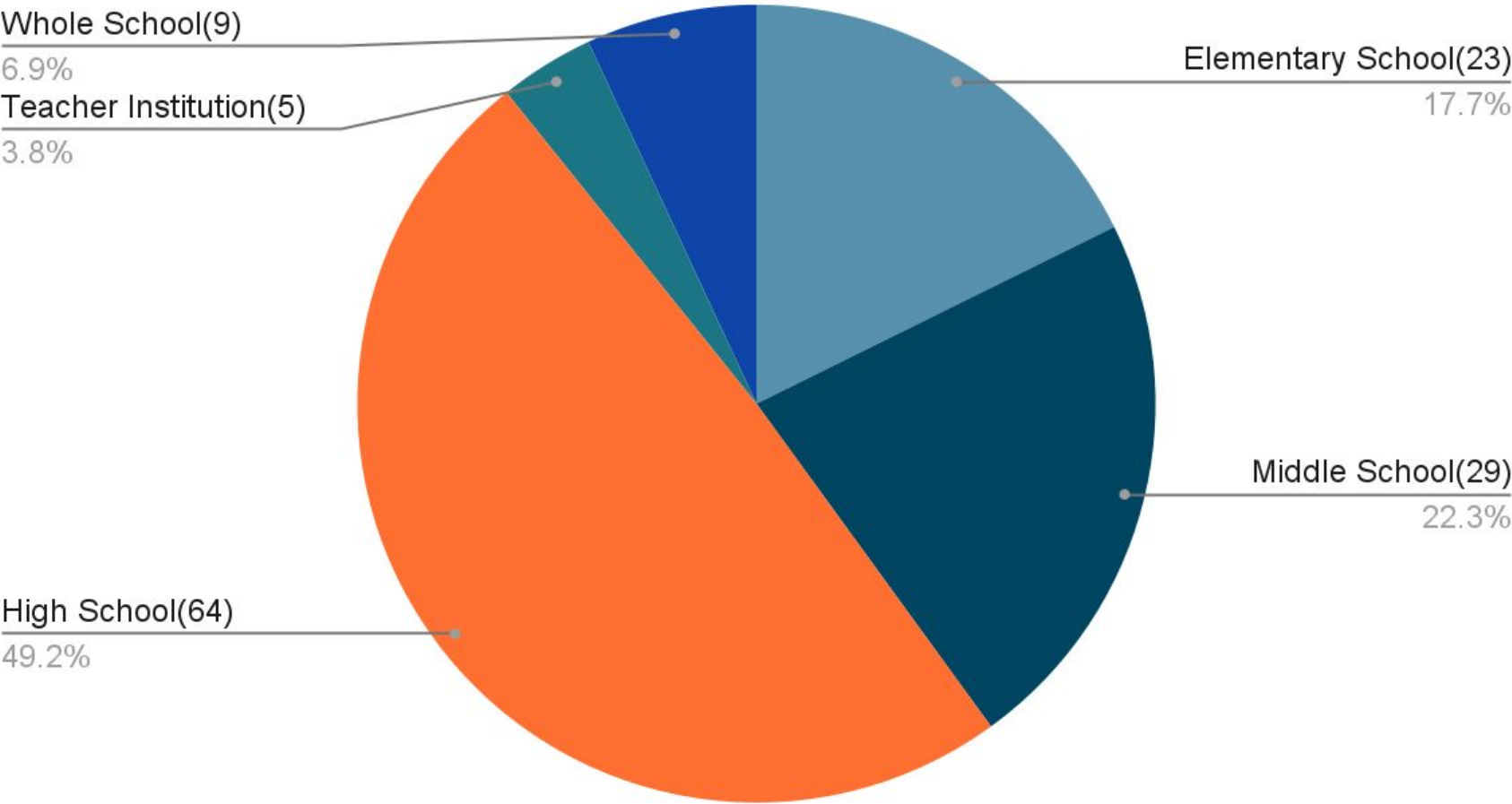
Result of the 2021 SPONGE Campaign

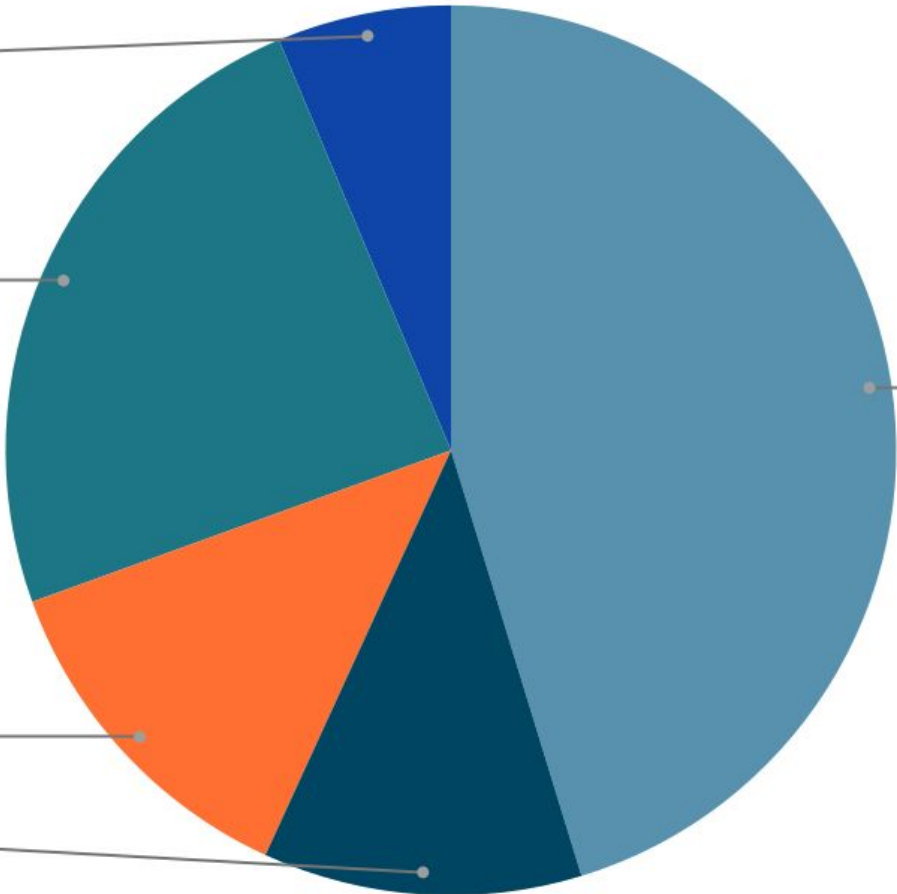
