

a house with traditional Korean architecture


a thatched cottage: a house with a roof connected with rice straw, wheat straw, reed

2 Types of Hanoks

Giwajip : a tiled house

Daecheong Maru of Hanok

- a large floor between rooms.(Daecheong Maru is located in the center of Hanok)
- Eaves where the floor is located are higher than others
- The hot air rises upward and there is always a cool breeze in the Daecheong
- It is used as a space where members of the family gather to have a meeting or treat guests




Features of boiler

disadvantages



There's a superstition that leaving a broom standing up at night invites evil spirits.




A family-oriented residential culture

In general, the living room and kitchen are designed to be open to facilitate family communication.



In addition, community activities are active in apartment complexes and housing complexes.
