

Be an Explorer to Find Your Child's Strong Points

In what areas does your child feel accomplished?

Find achievement, joy, and satisfaction from the experiences of your children

If your children are the latter, guide them to record everything that they remember from their birth until now. Ask them what the most rewarding or satisfying experience was. - What are the activities that you're most confident in now?
- What are some of the experiences in which you excelled?
- Which activity gave you the most enjoyment and satisfaction?
- What aspect of yourself are you most proud of now?
