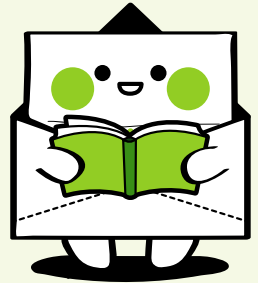

Our child enjoys YouTube more than books. The influence of videos has overcome books, and if you can't go back in time, wouldn't acquiring knowledge through video have a similar effect to reading?
I don't know if it's right to force a child who doesn't like reading to read.

Watching videos, including YouTube, is a completely different activity from “reading.”
Video is a “passive activity” that injects audio-visual information in a short period of time, making it difficult to exercise thinking skills or critically accept the content.



On the other hand, reading is an “active activity” that requires cognitive effort, and you experience the process of imagining and thinking about the contents of the text in your head.
In order to develop our child's literacy, we need to do “active activities” rather than “passive activities”!



Through “reading”, you can develop your child's literacy when you ‘think’ and ‘question’ in your own way!
First, let's figure out what your child's literacy level is, and then start reading activities that are appropriate for your child's literacy level.



Hold on! What is literacy?

Literacy refers to the ability to read and understand texts and to express one's thoughts verbally and in writing. Communicating one's thoughts effectively to others is fundamental to engaging in society. Literacy is not acquired in a day, but is developed through continuous reading and self-thinking process. In order to develop literacy, which is a key ability for social communication, shouldn't we first identify the level of literacy of our child and engage in appropriate reading activities? If you do an activity that is not suitable for your child's level, they'll lose interest as it is too easy and boring, or too difficult.



1 Literacy test to determine reading level

You can take the literacy test by accessing the QR code. The test is available from the 3rd grade of elementary school. Please proceed with the test appropriate for your child's grade.

2 Practice appropriate reading activities according to level

After the literacy test, look at the table below and help your child do reading activities that are appropriate for their literacy level! Just 10 minutes a day.

Category	Vocabulary	Reasoning	Understanding information
0~4 points	Read and review difficult books or textbooks for grades lower than the current grade several times	Think about the meaning of the sentence and try to understanding	Practice reading carefully even short texts
5~8 points	When there are words you do not know, find the meaning of the word and organize it.	Check the part you do not understand in the text and completely understand it	Find and check sentences that you do not understand, and practice getting used to various sentences
9~19 points	Read a slightly more difficult text	Read texts from a variety of subjects and perspectives	Practice reading long and complex sentences
